Microschools are a uniquely tailored educational option that can take place in a variety of places such as a home, community center, or library meeting room. They are frequently organized by parents, either with parents themselves teaching or hiring an instructor consistent with a family's needs. Children who attend a Microschool are homeschoolers. Microschools can have a few students or hundreds, with the schedules and curriculum tailored to fit unique needs, environment, or focus.

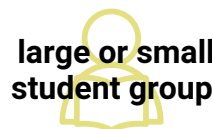
